

The Yale Carbon Charge Project is testing the effectiveness and feasibility of carbon pricing on Yale's campus. This applied research has implications for energy and climate change mitigation policy in companies, institutions and governments. Yale is the first university in the world to implement internal carbon pricing.

Interns will work at the forefront of policy development, implementation and research in the rapidly growing field of carbon pricing. The work will include:

- Performing quantitative and qualitative analyses to understand the implications of the carbon charge policy options
- Developing and implementing communications strategy and tactics for the carbon charge
- Helping Yale schools implement energy conservation measures
- Working out operations challenges within the interface between schools and Yale Facilities
- Guiding ongoing student research projects on the carbon charge

The following skills will contribute to a candidate's success:

- Internal motivation to figure out how best to implement carbon pricing policy
- Enthusiasm for testing ideas
- Ability to think and communicate clearly, verbally and in writing
- Quantitative ability
- Graphic design capability
- Knowledge of climate change policy and carbon pricing
- Field research experience
- Policy development experience
